

Band Members' Military Service History

Bill Barlow (Tuba) served as a Navy musician in Washington, D.C., Little Creek, Virginia, Norfolk, Virginia, and Pensacola, Florida, from October 1963 to October 1967. In 1966, he did a tour on the USS Intrepid in Vietnam and currently belongs to the Navy Musician's Association.

Rick Floyd (Euphonium) served in the U.S. Air Force during the Vietnam era as a radar technician (1966-1970). His last assignment was presidential support (Homestead AFB, Florida) during President Richard Nixon's administration.

Al Horner (Trombone) served more than 20 years (1973-1993) in the U.S. Army and Army Reserve as a Medical Service Corps Officer, serving as a Hospital Administrator and IT Officer during his four years of active duty, stationed at the Presidio of San Francisco, California, and Ft. Detrick, Maryland. He then served in the Army Reserve in a variety of staff roles in the 324th Combat Support Hospital, retiring in 1993 as the Executive Officer of the hospital.

Don Rothenberg (Trumpet) was stationed in Darmstadt, Germany (1955-1957, where he organized and directed the U.S. Army V Corps Artillery Band, performing at parades and special events.

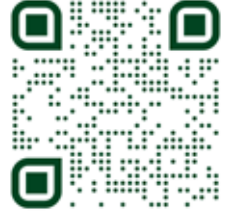
